

Research Ethics Committee: Animal (REC-A)

he Nelson Mandela University Research Ethics Committee (Animal) (REC-A) is charged with monitoring t Ine Nesson Mandeia Juniversity research stricts Committee (Anima) (tet-CA) is charged with monitoring the treatment of animals used in both research and teaching at the institution. It has the responsibility of reviewin all protocols involving animal use in order to ensure that they are in accordance with acceptable ethical an scientific standards as described in the South African National Standard for the Care and Use of Animals for Scientific Standards as described in the South African National Standard for the Care and Use of Animals for Scientific Purposes 10386:2021. The RECA assists the institution in complying with legislation and creating as awareness of ethical conduct in researchers and teachers.

Respect for animals must underpin all decisions and actions of the people involved in the care and use o nimals for scientific purposes. This respect is demonstrated by

The RECA is a sub-committee of the Research and Engagement Committee.

Terms of reference

- Examines proposed experimental and teaching protocols submitted by institutional staff with reference to the likely harm that may be caused to the animals and likely benefits that may arise from such work and determines how these considerations are weighted in relation to each other, Examines hypotheses to ensure they are well considered, plausible, and have a reasonable prospect of yielding good results; Approves applications that comply with the ethical principles for humane animal experimentation; Proposes amendments and modifications, seeks califications and requests revised submissions in the case (a)



Application for Approval (Research): Any activity involving the acquisition, keeping or use of live animals for a research study, requires completion of this form and submission for approval to REC-A.

Change the Work

- Application for Approval (Practical): Any activity involving the acquisition, keeping or use of live animals for practical work, requires completion of this form and submission for approval to REC-A.
- Application for External Animal Sample Collection: Completion of this form is required where there is a need to acquire already existing animal samples.
- Application to use External Data from Animal Sample Collection: Completion of this form is required where there is a need for previously collected/secondary data to be used in a study.
- Application for Extension to an Approved RECA Project: Completion of this form is required before the current ethics approval period lapses.
- Annual Progress Report
- Completion Project Report: Completion of this form is required as soon as a project registered with REC-A has been completed.
- Unexpected Mortality/Adverse Events Report
- Praft Monitoring Forms: This includes templates for animal housing, project folder cover page, Animal daily checklist, Field checklist, Practical checklist.



Applying for Ethics Approval from REC-A

All applications for approval must be submitted online on MEOS (Mandela Ethics Online System). This includes:

- Research studies: Any activity involving the acquisition, keeping or use of live animals for a research study
- · Practicals: Any activity involving the acquisition, keeping or use of live animals for practical work
- Use of an External Animal Sample Collection: Any activity that requires the acquisition of already existing animal samples
- · Use of Data from an Animal Sample Collection: Any activity where there there is a need for previously collected/secondary data to be used in a study
- Extension Applications
- Amendments to an Approved Protocol
- Reporting of an Unexpected Mortality/Adverse Event
- · Reporting the Closure of a Research Study

Reporting Research Misconduct


